

More than just retail

Boston is set in the heart of Lincolnshire's dramatic Fenland, a classic market town found on the edge of the famous Wash, filled with history and character. Once a centre of trade, and second only to London in the United Kingdom, now farming and the food industry dominate with the surrounding land making one quarter of England's total land utilised for horticulture.




